### **GIVE THEM THE LOVE OF CHRIST**

### Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Today we celebrate the Ascension of our Lord. As we say in the Creed, "He ascended into Heaven ... [to] the right hand of God the Father Almighty." His disciples were perplexed about His going. Clearly, some wanted Him to stay and establish a worldly kingdom like that of King David or of King Solomon. They asked Him "Lord ... are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?" (Acts 1:6) and even Mary Magdalen had wanted Him to stay with them. So Jesus had to say to her "Do not hold me, for ... I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God" (John 20:17).

The Kingdom of God, which is the fruit of the new and eternal covenant made in the blood of Jesus Christ, is something much, much better than any earthly conception of glory or of peace. Jesus came to establish the eternal Kingdom of God, wherein we are all invited to be part of the family of God. We are adopted as sons and daughters of the Father, brothers and sisters of Jesus Christ Himself. What an amazing and transcendent reality. As St John wrote to the people of the new covenant, "See what love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God; and so we are. The reason why the world does not know us is that it did not know him. Beloved, we are God's children now; it does not yet appear what we shall be, but we know that when He appears we shall be like him, for we shall see Him as He is"



(1 John 3:1-2).

So Jesus ascended to Heaven to the right hand of the Father, not to leave us, but to lead us home to Heaven. He does not abandon His people, He gives us the amazing hope that clinging to faith in Him, and obedient to His commandments to love God and love our neighbours, we will be with Him in Heaven in the fullness of time.

In the meantime, we are united with Jesus through His mystical body – His Church. Through the Church we are baptized into the death of Christ and into His resurrection. Thus we can live in Him now. Through the sacraments and the Word of God we are united with Him. And we are called into the saving mission of Jesus Christ our Lord to bring His life to all the world. If the risen Jesus had remained on earth, He would only have been in one place, but now through of the power of the Holy Spirit He is present, in His Church, in every part of the world and in every era.

Every baptized person is, in a real sense, Christ present in the world. As St Teresa of Avila wrote, "Jesus Christ has no body on earth but yours, no hands but yours, no feet but yours. Yours are the eyes through which Christ's compassion is to look out on this world. Yours are the feet with which Christ goes about doing good. Yours are the hands with which Christ is to bless all people now."

Let us give thanks to God for the immense gift of love we have been given through Jesus and trusting in the power of His love – the Holy Spirit dwelling in us – let us resolve to play our part in His mission, every one of us, going out to the people around us to make disciples of Jesus our Lord and so help His Kingdom come.
