THE GLORY RETURNS TO THE TEMPLE

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In our Gospel today, Joseph and Mary take Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem to make the offering of a pair of turtledoves or pigeons in accordance with the Law of the Lord. The devout and Spirit-filled Simeon was there and spoke prophetically that the child was the salvation which God had been preparing for all nations to see - the light which would enlighten the pagans and be the glory of Israel – the People of God.

Now to the devout Israelites, the Temple was the centre of the whole world. It was the place where the glory of God touched the world and its peoples. It was meant to be the light to the nations. In the very heart of the Temple, in the Holy of Holies – the Tabernacle, there was supposed to rest the Ark of the Covenant, containing the tablets of stone on which were the Ten

Commandments by which God had bound Himself to His people. In that most sacred space, God's glory was meant to reside – the shekinah, which meant the indwelling of the Lord. This was the cloud of glory by day and the column of flame by night which had led the chosen people out of the desert and had lived with them in their portable Tabernacle. Sadly, by Jesus' day, the Ark of the Covenant had been lost and the shekinah-glory had left the temple (see Ezekiel ch. 10). The great expectation of all devout Jews was that somehow the glory of the Lord would come back into the Temple, and the Lord would again be present to them. This was the hope of the people for a Messiah, the Christ,



who would come and restore the Temple worship to what it had once been. That is what Malachi prophesies in our first reading (Malachi 3:1-4). It was for this return of the glory of the Lord to the Temple that Simeon longed.

Although those around would not have known it, on that day, in the person of a little baby boy only six weeks old, the Lord Himself had come into the Temple. He Himself would become the ultimate sacrifice (the once-and-for-all offering) by His atoning death for us on the Cross. And by His resurrection and the gift of Himself to us in the Eucharist, Jesus would make a new covenant with His people of all nations and races – a new and eternal covenant sealed by His own precious blood.

Today, we can enter into the great glory of the presence of God with His people, in Holy Mass. His is present to us in a way which was never available to the Israelites of old. Not even the power of the shekinah-glory or the presence of the Ark of the Covenant can hold a candle to the true presence of God with us in the Mass and the communion with God given by Jesus coming to us in the Eucharist. "Four Organists; Four Centuries of Organ Music"

2pm, Saturday 15th February, 2020 | St Mary's Cathedral, Hobart

This performance will open the St Mary's Cathedral Concert Series for 2020, a new incentive to showcase the recent growth of the musical tradition at the cathedral.



St Mary's is lucky enough to have four resident organists: Ben Mackey – Director of

Music, Jo-Anne Kemp – Deputy Director of Music, Alexander Rodrigues – former Acting Director of Music, and Teresa Smith – Cathedral Organ Scholar. The programme will feature music not limited to pieces written by Girolamo Frescobaldi, a seventeenth century Vatican Organist, through J.S. Bach and Cesar Franck to living composer Giles Swayne, who uses Senegalese rhythms and minimalism as part of his musical language. The three-manual organ, built by Fincham and Hobday will showcase a kaleidoscopic soundscape ranging from the softest flutes, strings and mutation stops to the full, grand organ with its bold reeds. St Mary's is one of the few cathedrals in the country to offer an Organ Scholarship, which is an apprenticeship for a young aspiring organist. The Organ Scholarship scheme is very common in the UK, and many former Organ Scholars have gone onto renowned careers as performers, composers and conductors. Proceeds of the concert will go to the restoration of the Cathedral as well as the Cathedral Music Programme.
