CONTINUING CATHEDRAL RESTORATION

This weekend, His Grace Archbishop Julian Porteous will be launching the commencement of the interior restoration of St Mary's Cathedral, Hobart.

Continuing the process that commenced in the early 2000s, which concluded with the construction of the Cathedral Centre and crypt, we are progressing onwards to restoring work on the interior of the Cathedral itself in the following aspects:

- Exhumation of Archbishops buried within the Cathedral and reinternment in the Cathedral Crypt
- Restoration of the Cathedral Sanctuary
- Installing in-floor heating
- Levelling, sanding, and polishing the wooden floorboards.
- Installing LED lighting
- Addressing disability access

The Cathedral restoration project, overseen by the Cathedral Restoration Committee, respects the Cathedral's original neo-gothic architecture and layout while keeping the design in line with the style and liturgical aspects of the Cathedral. The work will occur progressively over the coming months. More information will be provided in the upcoming issue of the Catholic Standard.

The Cathedral Parish Pastoral Council has been consulted by His Grace as the representative body of the Parish Community and will continue to keep the Parish informed as the project progresses.

Cathedral Parish Pastoral Council also wishes to acknowledge and thank for the on-going dedicated work of the Cathedral Restoration Committee.

We invite you to pray in the coming months for the restoration of the Cathedral through the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the patroness of our Cathedral.


