LORD, INCREASE OUR FAITH

We read today about a very human story of Jesus' reaction to the lack of faith of those who had known him from his early infancy until he left home to be 'about his Father's business'. Many books have been written and films produced which vividly tell interesting and challenging stories of people past and present. The knowledge we gain can influence the way we think, understand and act, hopefully for the better! I have often reflected on the life of Jesus as in a movie from the time of his infancy into childhood being cared for by Mary and Joseph and neighbours and those close to him. Then seeing Jesus growing into an adult working alongside of Joseph as a carpenter and becoming more aware of the relationship he established among those who knew him. Then the particular awareness of relationship with God his Heavenly Father "This is my Son, the Beloved, my favour rests on him." (Matt 3:17). Mary and Joseph accepted their role as responsible parents fulfilling God's will for them. At the Annunciation Mary's response to the Angel Gabriel was, "I am the handmaid of the Lord, let what you have said be done to me." (Lk 1:38) and Jesus' response to the will of his Father when he proclaimed in the Garden of Gethsemane, "Let it be as you, not I would have it. (Matt 26:39).

Once more Jesus and his disciples returned home to Nazareth. Previously they had spent many days ministering to the needs of the people. Jesus was constantly about his Father's business establishing the Kingdom of God among the

scribes and Pharisees, the unbelievers who were expecting Jesus to be a king of worldly ambition, of power, prestige, wealth and domination. Let us reflect on our own attempts to know, understand and act as we make efforts to establish the Kingdom of God among those we meet in our everyday lives. It must have been frustrating and bewildering for Jesus to hear, see and know that those who were close to him were not accepting his message of truth. "The truth will make you free." The people asked the following questions. "Where did this man get all this?" "What is the wisdom that has been granted to him and the miracles that are worked through him?" Jesus knew what they were thinking and saying about him. He replied, "A prophet is only despised in his own country and among his own relations and in his own house." In saying this Jesus was expressing his frustration and disappointment at their lack of faith. (Mk 6:4) Jesus invited his disciples to throw their nets out to starboard after failing to catch fish during the night. The results were very rewarding. Both St. John Paul II and our present Holy Father, Pope Francis are pleading with us to go out to the world around us and proclaim the Good News to those who have not yet heard the

Gospel story which has impacted on the lives of so many past, present and will into the future. This is our mis-



sion. Come, Lord Jesus, come. Show us the way!







Seminarians Support Dinner 2018

In Times Past ...

In November 1938 'The Catholic Standard' became just 'The Standard', but in dropping the word Catholic it technically became more 'officially' so. This confusing shift derived from the Archdiocese of Hobart adopting the local Catholic paper as its own in a more explicitly formal capacity than had been the case in the immediately preceding years. This shift elicited an interesting letter from a prominent Catholic laywoman, Dame Edith Lyons. She wrote to the rebranded 'new' paper with what the editor considered were 'valuable suggestions' for a Catholic press.

After writing in general terms about the role of the press, and the under-coverage of religious matters in the secular media, Dame Lyons turned to what she believed a Catholic press should do.

'The Catholic paper', she wrote, 'must be bright and interesting, entertaining even. It must give us instruction in so attractive a form that we will swallow large doses of it and like it! It must be something of an encyclopaedia. In every family where religion is a force, discussions are bound to arise on questions of theology and morals. The Catholic paper must supply the answer to all such problems. We are expecting great things of "The Standard." We want it to fill in a happy hour for the children, to give the "lad" of the house a few hints on social relationships that he will consider a little more reliable than mother's; we want it to keep father interested for at least ten minutes every evening, and we should like a little advice on how to make the home more attractive for very little cost.'

Whether Dame Lyons was satisfied with that first re-issue remains unclear. On the same page as

her letter there were two advertisements for different beers, perhaps a hint about father's 'ten minutes'. On the facing page was an advertisement for a cast iron stove, reportedly 'the secret of good cooking', which was the nearest thing in

that part of the paper to house beautification. It was probably not exactly what she had in mind. **Dr Nick Brodie**
